



Arlene Blum

has played a ground breaking role in women's mountaineering. She is best known for leading the 1st American, all-women ascent of Annapurna 1 – considered one of the world's most dangerous and difficult mountains.

Blum also led the first all-women team up Mt. McKinley and was the first American woman to attempt Mt. Everest. She has played a leading role in more than 20 mountain expeditions world-wide. Blum made the first traverse of the Great Himalaya Range of Bhutan, Nepal and India, and hiked the length of the European Alps with her baby daughter on her back.

Annapuma: A Woman's Place, written by Blum, has inspired tens of thousands of readers over the last 25 years.
